How It Began

The Heck-Jones® Offering is named for Fannie Heck and Sallie Bailey Jones. Two women who met God where He was working. They committed their lives to serving Him through the missions and ministry work of Woman's Missionary Union.

Fannie Heck, daughter of Colonel and Mrs. Jonathan Heck, was born in Virginia, in September 1862. When Fannie was three months old, Jonathan Heck moved his family to Warren County, NC and then later to Raleigh, NC. Sallie Bailey was born on January 29, 1869, in Greensville County, VA to Dr. and Mrs. C. T. Bailey. When Sallie was nine years old, her father bought the *Biblical* Recorder and moved his family to Raleigh, NC. In 1886, Dr. Theodore Whitfield, pastor of First Baptist Church, New Bern, and Vice President of the Foreign Mission Board, talked with Dr. C. T. Bailey, Editor of the Biblical Recorder, about the need for a new missions organization. This organization would assist and encourage missions work that was already being done in churches.

Attention turned to twenty three year old Fannie Heck to be the chairwoman of the organization. Fannie and her friend Sallie Bailey were already involved in ministry to children in a poor section of Raleigh through the First Baptist Church, Raleigh. Fannie agreed to chair the new Women's Central Committee of Missions. This organization was

the forerunner to the Woman's Missionary Union of NC. Little did these two young women realize in 1886, that their dedication and service would be a lifetime of missions work done through WMU.

Heck-Jones® Offering

Fannie Heck served thirty years as president of WMUNC until her death in 1915. During the thirty years Miss Heck served as president of WMUNC, she also served for fifteen years as president of the national WMU. When Miss Heck died, the now Sallie Bailey Jones, became President of WMUNC. Her role as president spanned from 1915 to 1935. She was elected President Emeritus for life and served on the Executive Committee until her death in 1943.

In 1924, nine years after Miss Fannie Heck's death, WMUNC's Executive Board established the "Heck Memorial Offering" in her memory. Funds raised through the years were used for WMUNC's mission work. In 1947, at the Annual WMU Meeting, the name of the offering was changed to the Heck-Jones® Memorial Offering, in honor of Fannie and Sallie.
