Many families do not use boxed or canned food items, making their meals with fresh foods. Gift cards give them freedom of making their own selections.

Cleaning supplies: Some suggested items include Mr. Clean white erasers, Lysol wipes, Lysol cleaner, sponges, hand soap, dish washing liquid, mop buckets, mops, brooms and dustpans.

Friday Activities:

Refugee Simulation

With the current Project HELP focus on Refugees, we desire to have healthy conversations about this topic. Participants in this activity will experience a walk-through Refugee Simulation allowing a small taste of what the refugee population faces in refugee camps or detention centers.

Tours of Welcome House Raleigh -

Welcome House Raleigh is a ministry which assists refugees who have fled in fear from countries of origin to the United States. Participants who choose this option will tour a temporary reception home for refugees who are resettled in the area and do not have

a place to live upon arrival. Welcome House provides a safe home, settlement assistance, and bridges into the community.

Missions Market

This activity offers 30 displays of "take-away" ideas for mission projects which can be implemented in churches and communities.

Book-signing and Reception



The weekend's theme was COLLIDE, with a scripture focus of John 13:35, They will know you are my disciples by your love. The students participated in prayer stations, worship, Bible study, and fellowship times together. Students were able to participate in break-out sessions led by Jay Baugham, Crystal Horton, Taylor Tharpe, Rick Trexler, and Jason Lawson who shared their involvement in missions and how they are living out their purpose through missions. Worship was led by Rachel White, Allison Mozingo, David Stone, and Mike Pittman. Local leaders shared about the work being done in Disaster Relief/Rebuild. The students made jump ropes for children of a local school who lost gym equipment during the hurricanes. Blankets were also made for displaced families of the hurricanes. On Friday, students spent long hours in rainy weather working on over 40 homes through the Baptists on Mission Rebuild Center. Students shared testimonies of time spent praying and encouraging families as well as repairing houses, removing trees and debris, and other projects. 

ere are testimonies from two of the 2018-2019 NC Acteens Panelists regarding why Acteens leaders should nominate for the 2019-2020 Panelist:

Maddy shares: "I think Acteens leaders should nominate Acteens to expose them to the opportunity of being chosen to serve on a wonderful board of sisters in Christ. The Acteens Panelist board is such a great way to share your thoughts on how mission work can be done, as well as providing panelists with Christian peers and mentors who encourage them in Christ!"





Annie shares: "There are several reasons why Acteens leaders should nominate their girls for the North Carolina Acteens Advisory Panel, including the fact that it gives them many wonderful opportunities to serve God by participating in and leading different mission projects and events. It also allows them to get to know some other great Christian girls!"

To nominate a young lady as an Acteens Panelist she:

- 1. Must be a Christian and an active member of a North Carolina Baptist Church.
- 2. Must be at least 14 years of age and in the ninth grade or above.
- 3. Must be a member of an Acteens organization.
- **4.** Must have at least one of the following options:
 - working on MissionsQuest,
 - served on an Acteens Activator Team,
 - works with a WMU age level organization such as Mission Friends, GAs or CAs. Since you are a part of Acteens this means that you are working with another WMU age level organization in your church.
 - participates/leads in ongoing Acteens/youth mission ministry projects.
- **5.** Must be willing to attend the following meetings: (WMU NC will provide lodging and meals.)
 - Panelists Retreat Summer or Fall 2019 (This is a mandatory retreat and the date is determined after the panelist are selected. The retreat is held in Kernersville, NC.)
 - Must agree to serve from July 2019 to August 2020.
- 6. Must remain active in Acteens throughout year of service.
- 7. Must have parental/guardian consent.
- Completed nomination application must be received in the WMU NC office by May 17, 2019.
- **9.** Chosen applicants will be mailed a Panelist Advisory application to complete.

Nomination application must be completed by the Acteens Advisor or WMU Director and mailed to the WMU NC office, PO Box 18309, Raleigh, NC 27619-8309, by May 17, 2019. Please be sure that the Acteen you are nominating meets the requirements above.

Carolina Girls (NC & SC) and their leaders came together on October 19-21, 2018 to serve and show love to refugees and internationals in Greensboro. The weekend focused on how and why to: love other cultures, build relationships with internationals and to be prepared to share the good news of the Gospel. The girls were challenged through conferences, missionary stories and participation in a refugee simulation. *Curious to know more? Missions Extravaganza 2019 will feature a refugee simulation. For the details check out page 3. Featured missionaries for the weekend were Jody & Tim Cross, NAMB missionaries in South Carolina and Jennifer & Mark Gragg, NAMB missionaries in North Carolina. They both serve and engage with refugees and internationals. The worship and music were exceptional as Allison Mozingo and Rachel White led this time of praise and worship. Cassie Taylor and Hannah Boehmer did an excellent job with each of the worship sessions as well as teaching conferences and doing so many other things!

NC Acteens Panelists, Maddy Davis, Kendall Hilliard and Anne Stroupe set up, shared, and prayed for missionaries on the prayer calendar. A SC Acteens group shared their gifts by presenting the theme interpretation. Kym Mitchell from Birmingham did an outstanding job of facilitating and leading groups through the refugee simulation. This was powerful!

CG partnered with local agencies that work with refugees and internationals. On Saturday the girls and leaders experienced *living missions* through a meet-up at a local park, thanks to Brenda

Gray. The children acted out the scripture passage of Jesus calming the storm in Matthew 8:23-27; acting as the disciples, waves and thunder clouds. The children then made wind socks to remind them that God is the one who controls the wind.

Teen girls and leaders made jump ropes from plastic bags and excitedly shared them at the project sites. Several groups were able to go and experience the International Market, engaging with the people. This provided the girls an opportunity to learn about different people-groups, their cultures, and foods. The weekend concluded with a closing worship gathering on Saturday evening. Several groups were able to worship at *Burmese Karen Church* in Greensboro. What a wonderful weekend that helped each of us learn about *Loving the Nations, Starting in Your Community*.

or the first time this year, we will be offering a **Kids Camp at Missions Extravaganza!** The camp will begin Saturday and run from 9am-3pm. The camp

Equipping & Encouraging Women Who Lead

"Inistry is hard. Church can be hard. And sometimes, people are hard to love." These are the words author and speaker Jackie Hill Perry spoke in a room of over 1,600 leaders at the LifeWay Women's Leadership Forum

I attended this past fall. Jackie spoke about the hardships in ministry in a very honest way, but she didn't stop there. She encouraged us to keep going. She taught us about the importance of seasons in leadership and she inspired us to keep being missional and testifying about what God has done in our lives.

She was right. **Sometimes ministry is hard.** Sometimes things happen in our churches that cause us to grow weary, and sometimes we can get discouraged in leadership. But we must stand firm!

There is a reason Paul wrote these words to the church in Corinth. "Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." (1 Corinthians 15:58). Paul knew of the hardships in ministry because he had experienced difficulties himself. He knew people would need encouragement to keep pursuing the Lord, because at times he needed encouragement too. Paul spent a lot of his ministry pouring into other leaders because he knew they would

grow weary at times and need support to remain strong in the faith.

Leaders, stand firm. Keep working for the Lord and know that your labor is not in vain. That doesn't mean you exhaust yourself serving on every committee. It means you remain steadfast on The Word of God and its truth. It means that you keep pursuing a personal relationship with Jesus first, and trust the rest to fall into place. Be encouraged. God is working around you and through you and He wants you to stand firm in His love.






